



AWS CLEARINGHOUSE ORDER PUBLISHED IN FEDERAL REGISTER

Today, the Commission's Order selecting CTIA Spectrum Clearinghouse, LLC® as a designated clearinghouse for the Advanced Wireless Services ("AWS") spectrum was published in the Federal Register, triggering the 30 day window to file executed relocation agreements with a clearinghouse.

Under the terms of the Order, AWS licensees who incurred relocation costs after November 29, 2006 are entitled to reimbursement under the cost-sharing plan. Thus, if your company intends to seek cost-sharing for a microwave link or BRS facility in the AWS bands where the relocation agreement was signed between November 29, 2006 and today, you must register that agreement with a clearinghouse within 30 calendar days of the August 1, 2007 Federal Register publication date. Relocation costs for microwave and BRS facilities moved pursuant to agreements signed between November 29, 2006 and August 1, 2007 will not be eligible for cost-sharing **unless registration occurs on or before August 31, 2007**. On a going forward basis, relocation agreements must be registered within 30 days of the signing. Previously registered relocation agreements do not need to be resubmitted.
